



FY10 Adopted Budget for New York City Summary of Actions Taken by the City Council to Restore Services for Children

Child Welfare

- \$3.7 million restored for the Child Safety Initiative to reduce caseloads at preventive service programs
- \$3.0 million to restore 100 ACS child welfare staff, averting some proposed layoffs (PEG Restoration)
- \$270,000 restored for the CONNECT domestic violence program
- \$200,000 restored for the Brooklyn Family Justice Center
- \$500,000 restored for Child Advocacy Centers
- Proposed 5% cut to foster care agencies internally addressed by ACS and will not be implemented

Early Care and Education

- \$8.0 million to restore 31 child care center classrooms
- \$1.2 million restored for Provider's Choice funding for family child care providers to purchase educational supplies
- \$1.5 million restored to extend half-day UPK to full day UPK in community based organizations

Education

- \$2.0 million restored for the Dropout Prevention and Intervention Initiative
- \$2.5 million restored for Urban Advantage Science Education
- \$4.0 million to restore a partial budget reduction for school custodians (PEG restoration)
- \$300,000 to restore Chess in Schools

Food

- \$270,000 restored for Food Stamps at Farmers' markets
- \$2.0 million restored for food pantries

Health

- \$545,000 restored for the Asthma Control Initiative
- \$5.0 million restored for Child Health Clinics
- \$400,000 restored (partial restoration) for the Hip Hop Heals Healthy Eating & Living in Schools Initiative (formerly the Comprehensive Podiatric Medical Screening Initiative)
- \$368,000 restored for Family Planning
- \$3.546 million restored for the Infant Mortality Initiative
- \$268,000 restored for the NYU Mobile Dental van
- \$2.5 million restored (partial restoration) for the Obesity Prevention Initiative
- \$2.75 million restored for the Primary Care Initiative (PEG Restoration)

Juvenile Justice

- \$640,000 restored (partial restoration) for the Discharge Planning: Collaborative Family Initiative

Housing and Homeless Services

- \$250,000 restored for the Citywide Homeless Prevention Fund (DHS)
- \$500,000 restored for the Citywide Task Force on Housing Court (HPD)
- \$830,000 restored for Community Consultants (HPD)
- \$1.5 million restored for the Housing Preservation Initiative (HPD)

Legal Services

- \$1.5 million restored for Citywide Civil Legal Services initiative
- \$300,000 restored for the Keeping Families Together Initiative (Legal Services NYC)
- \$500,000 restored for Legal Information for Families Today (LIFT)
- \$1.05 million restored for Legal Services for eth Working Poor
- \$100,000 restored for MFY Legal Services
- \$1.3 million restored for Unemployment/SSI Program
- \$2.25 million restored for Anti-Eviction Legal Services

Youth Development

- \$5.1 million restored for CASA, cultural after school programs
- \$3.8 million restored for the After-Three Corporation
- \$3.5 million restored for Beacon Programs
- \$1.0 million restored for Neighborhood Youth Alliance/Street Outreach
- \$800,000 restored for the New York Junior Tennis League
- \$4.572 million restored for Out-of-School Time (OST) Option II (PEG Restoration)
- \$5.42 million restored for Shelter Beds for at Risk, Runaway and Homeless Youth
- \$1.2 million restored for Sports & Arts in Schools Foundation
- \$500,000 restored for the YMCA Virtual Y Program

Mental Health

- \$1.5 million restoration for the Autism Awareness Initiative
- \$1.6 million restoration for the Children-Under Five Initiative
- \$800,000 restoration for HHC mental health, substance abuse and mental retardation/developmental disability services (PEG restoration)
- \$975,000 restoration for mental health contracts.
